
**During Lent we will be having a series of sermons under the title 'What does a book written over 2000 years ago and published in English 400 years ago have to say to us today?'**

- March 13<sup>th</sup>: ... about itself
- March 20<sup>th</sup>: ... about stress
- March 27<sup>th</sup>: ... about love and marriage
- April 3<sup>rd</sup>: ... about family life
- April 10<sup>th</sup>: ... about getting older
- April 17<sup>th</sup>: ... about work

This is part of our celebration of the 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the production of the King James Version of the Bible. In 1603 James VI of Scotland acceded to the throne of England (as James I of England). At the 1604 Hampton Court Conference James 1 was persuaded that a new translation was needed and ordered work to begin. The King James Version of the bible became enormously influential all around the world for a number of reasons. The Pilgrim Fathers went to America taking the English Bible with them; British sailors took the Bible on voyages around the globe; through the work of the East India Company it was taken to India and to the colonies in Africa, Australia and New Zealand. *"The King James Bible is a cornerstone of our culture and our language. Whatever our faith, whatever we believe, we have to recognise that the rhetorical power of this book, and in particular its power to fuse history with poetry, connects at the most fundamental level with our own history and poetry."* Andrew Motion, Poet Laureate 1999-2009
