### The letter of St Paul to the Romans.

#### Key verses for August

We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him (Romans 8v28)

If you declare with your mouth 'Jesus is Lord' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. (Romans 10v9)

Offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God - this is your true worship (Romans 12v1)

Love must be sincere (Romans 12v9)

#### Key thought

Having shared with the Christians at Rome his understanding of the meaning of Jesus' death and resurrection, St. Paul uses the second part of his letter to spell out the practical implications of the good news in everyday life.

How about using some time during August to read the whole of St Paul's letter to the Romans, preferably in a modern translation?

On August 24th, Jenny Endall is going to Kenya to teach at St Andrew's School. She will be involved in taking school assemblies and would value some resource books.
